The Vicar Writes:

Dear Friends,

As we move from March into April – from Winter into Spring – and from Lent to Easter, our minds naturally turn to the theme of new beginnings. And that is a theme that will run through our church life in the coming months, also, as we think together about how we might move forward in our mission and ministry.

Back in February, during one of my sermons, I asked the question: 'do we want to grow, or go?', asking us to consider whether we felt we had the energy, the drive, the vision to reach out to our parish and as such to hopefully grow our church, or whether we felt that we were happy with how things were, and that we, as someone said to me, were the 'last remnant.' 

All you have to do is decorate an egg or eggs and bring them to church on or before the 20th April. The competition winners will be chosen during our Easter Day service, after the Easter Egg hunt. Make sure your entry is labelled with your name and contact details. Categories are 0-4 years, 5-10 years, 11-17 years and 18+, please encourage family and friends to join in, the more eggs, the merrier!

You can hard boil your egg first, or have a go at emptying the egg prior to decorating. You can paint or decorate your egg(s) however you like- there is no theme, see where your imagination takes you! You can even make egg characters and create a scene for them to sit in....there's a hint as to what I might be doing


Egg Blowing

You will need:

- Fresh eggs in an egg box
- A pin or safety pin
- A toothpick
- A straw
- A measuring jug or bowl
- Pens, paints and other art materials to decorate



1.Sit an egg in your egg box to steady it. Holding the egg still, carefully tap and push a hole in the top centre of the egg with your pin. Once you have made the hole, carefully push one end of the pin in as far as it will go to widen it.



- 2. Take the toothpick and insert it into the hole; stir it around to help break up the yolk and make it easier to remove the insides at step 4.
- 3.Flip the egg over and make a second hole on the bottom with your pin. Try to make the hole on the bottom a little bigger but be careful not to crack the shell. Break up the yolk

again with your toothpick. Put your finger and thumb over the opposing holes and give the egg a good shake, to loosen the contents.

4. Hold the egg over a measuring jug with the bigger hole facing down. Use a straw to flush out the contents of the egg by placing the tip of the straw over the hole and blowing hard. It can take a minute to get going, so be patient. You will know that it's all out when it becomes lighter and you are just blowing out bubbles of egg white, followed by air.




5.Clean the shell by holding it carefully under running hot water from the kitchen tap. Wipe carefully with kitchen paper and leave to dry. Now you're ready to decorate with paint, pens, stickers, felt, glitter or whatever else takes your fancy.

It was:

175 years ago, on 16th April 1850 that Madame Marie Tussaud died. She was a French artist known for her wax sculptures, and the founder of Madame Tussaud's wax museum in London.

100 years ago, on 10th April 1925 that F Scott Fitzgerald's novel *The Great Gatsby*, was published.

80 years ago, on 30th April 1945 that Adolf Hitler, Austrian-born German Nazi Party Leader, Chancellor of Germany (1933-45) and dictator (1934-45) committed suicide along with his wife, Eva Braun.

70 years ago, on 5th April 1955 that Prime Minister Winston Churchill announced his retirement because of failing health. He was succeeded by Anthony Eden on 7th April.

Also 70 years ago, on 18th April 1955, that Albert Einstein, Germanborn American theoretical physicist, died. Considered the most influential physicist of the 20th century, he was known for developing the special and general theories of relativity.

65 years ago, on 1st April 1960 that Dr Martens boots went on sale in the UK.

25 years ago, on 22nd April 2000 that the 'The Big Number' change took place on the UK's telephone system. Many area codes were updated or replaced, and new ones created for mobile, freephone, local rate, national rate, and premium rate services.
